### **3. OPENING GUEST REMARKS: Lt. Gov. Joshua F. Tenorio**

- a. Chairperson Senator Taitague introduced Lieutenant Governor of Guam Honorable Joshua F. Tenorio, who is off island but recorded a video message for the Artificial Intelligence Task Force (AITF).
- b. Lieutenant Governor Tenorio thanked Senator Taitague for introducing legislation that created AITF. By creating Public Law 38-77, we intend to think carefully about technology shaping our future.
- c. We want Guam to adopt AI in a way that protects our people, strengthens our economy & reflects our values.
- d. History suggests that new technologies do not simply erase work, they shape it. AI itself will not take jobs, but people who know how to use AI effectively will increasingly compete for them. Our responsibility is to ensure that the people of Guam are prepared to use it.
- e. Establishing trust with the people of Guam is essential. If AI is going to assist in decisions about healthcare, education, lending or public safety, people deserve confidence that those systems are transparent, accountable and fair. That is precisely the responsibility this task force now carries.
- f. One more advantage is that smaller communities like Guam sometimes can move faster. We can bring experts together quickly. We can test ideas sooner and we can design policies that reflect the values of our community before technologies become too entrenched to shape.
- g. Lt. Gov. Tenorio thanked the members of AITF for your willingness to serve and help ensure that this technology evolves in a way that reflects the needs, the values and the future of all the people of Guam.

## 6. Chairperson Senator Taitague Special Remarks

- a. Chairperson Senator Taitague thanked Atty Bonardi for stepping up and agreeing to chair the Penalties, Fines and Enforcement of AI Crimes subcommittee.
  - b. Senator Taitague opened the floor to members who would like to join or add members to any of the existing subcommittees. She added that it is imperative that resumes of potential members be reviewed prior to adding on more members to ensure they are the “right fit” for that subcommittee.
  - c. David Dell’Isolla reserved the right to add more members later.
  - d. Dr. Joleen Aguon requested to join the AI Integration at the Workplace committee. The hospital is already piloting an AI at the Workplace program.
  - e. Esther Aguigui volunteered to join the Penalties, Fines and Enforcement of AI Crimes committee. She added the new TAG Adjunct General Watson to her subcommittee: US & International AI Policies, Guidelines and Infrastructure.
  - f. Dr. Joleen Aguon recommended Manny Gabriel, head of GMH’s IT department, to replace her on the US & Intl AI Policies, Guidelines and Infrastructure committee.
  - g. Senator Telo Taitague thanked Lt. Governor Joshua Tenorio and NCSL Director Heather Morton, for their special opening remarks. The National Conference of State Legislators is available at any time to provide assistance and information. Their contact information is provided in your membership folders.
  - h. Bill No. 64-38 is included in your folders. Senator Taitague emphasized that this task force has specific responsibilities and timelines that must be adhered to. Each subcommittee must meet monthly or more as needed. Meetings can take place via zoom and Senator Taitague offered her conference room and office as possible meeting venues.
  - i. Subcommittee chairs are allowed and encouraged to invite others outside of the task force to join and contribute to this AI task force.
  - j. Chairs must also present a report on their subcommittee’s activities at every task force meeting which will take place every other month.

## **7. Adoption of the Task Force Logo**

- a. Chairperson Senator Taitague presented the logo and asked the floor if there were any objections that this will be our official task force logo.
  - b. There were no objections. So ordered that the design presented will be the official logo of the AI Task Force.

## **8. Ratify Subcommittee Chair and Membership Positions**

- a. Chairperson Senator Taitague moved to ratify the subcommittee members who are the chairs in their position. She asked the floor if there were any objections to those who have taken on the chairmanship of any subcommittee.
- b. There were no objections. So ordered and the subcommittee chairmanship has been ratified.
- c. Chairperson Senator Taitague reminded the task force that AITF will meet every second Monday of every other month. The floor was open for discussion.
- d. AITF member, Lola Leon Guerrero, asked if the meetings must be in person or can they meet virtually? For convenience, Senator Taitague is allowing subcommittees to meet virtually if they choose to do so.
- e. AITF co-chairperson, Bea Santos, asked if there are any objections to combining subcommittee meetings since many of these committees share the same members. Senator Taitague asked the floor if there were any objections to her request, especially since there is an overlap of members. There were no objections.
- f. Lola Leon Guerrero asked if her proxy was required to attend the subcommittee meetings because BSP is a small agency. Senator Taitague reiterated the purpose of a proxy and stated that if the proxy watches the recordings and stays up to date with important matters as it pertains to the subcommittee.
- g. Senator Taitague opened the floor for feedback on whether subcommittee meetings should be recorded.
- h. Nathan Tennyson, Judiciary of Guam, suggested that it would be a good idea especially since AI is a good tool to summarize meetings. These summaries would be helpful for the record for posterity and other things. Leveraging AI in that way would be extremely helpful.

- i. Chairperson Taitague stated that she will leave it up to the chairperson to ensure that their meetings are well-documented and easy to share.
  - j. AITF Member Esther Aguigui asked if there is a basic presentation that Chairperson Taitague is looking for from each subcommittee because she already prepared a power point presentation for AITF. Does she want us to establish a baseline on what kind of policies exist in the international topography compared to what the United States policies are and maybe how we can shape all of that to apply to Guam's AI policies. Establish AI committee goals and provide general guidelines.
  - k. Chairperson Taitague stated that the taskforce findings will be presented to the Speaker and the Governor, so she is leaving it up to the respective chairpersons to figure out and put together a well-versed AI presentation.
  - l. Dr. Joleen Aguon wanted to thank Chairperson Telo Taitague for putting this AITF together. The hospital has been piloting AI at the bedside and trying to find ways to improve their efficiency and create better processes using technology. Her team just attended an off island high-tech AI healthcare conference and the amount of technology available is amazing. She is excited because now this has become a community effort.
